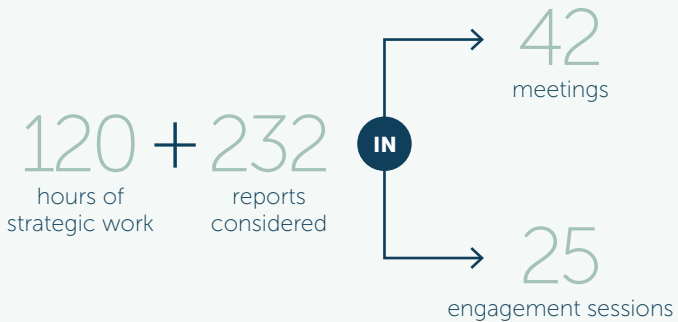

PROSPEROUS

- 8.6% more people moving around the City on weekdays
- More than \$620,000 provided to businesses through grants (in 20/21 and 21/22)
- More than 326,000 patrons used 3-hours free parking offer. More than 240,000 patrons used our 1-hour free parking offer
- More than 160 volunteers contributed 18,000 hours to supporting city services
- Made the City the home of the 2021 AFL Grand Final with 45,700 people at City-led events
- Processed more than 2,550 activity approvals applications for events, outdoor dining, footpath and road obstruction permits and work permit extensions



LIVEABLE

- Safe Night Space for women accessed more than 2,500 times since it opened on 31 May. Safe Night Shelter for men accessed 341 times during two-month trial
- Introduced the Clean Machine spot cleaning service around the malls and laneways
- More than 110,000 books and more than 55,000 audio and ebooks borrowed from the Library
- 135 storytimes and rhyme time sessions held at the Library attended by more than 2,600 people
- Free Hollywood Tuesday morning shows – 41 held in 2021, average attendance 140 - 180 people
- Welcomed 459 new citizens from more than 25 countries at nine citizenship ceremonies



SUSTAINABLE

- Ensured City's financial vision for next 10 years through Long Term Financial Plan
- Vision for the City established through first ever Local Planning Strategy
- 6.64 million containers diverted from landfill through Containers for Change program
- Around 12,900 square metres of graffiti removed from city buildings and infrastructure
- Sent more than 300,000 letters and emails to stakeholders about strategic projects
- City of Perth carried out 76 aquatic facility inspections, 2070 food business hygiene inspections, 132 public building safety inspections and 232 public event risk assessments
