In small groups, participants had five minutes each for the word ‘equity’, ‘diversity’ and ‘inclusion’ to brainstorm what this looks and feels like to them.• Activity 2 – Emotion Flashcards. Individually, the group visited a table covered in photos and selected a photo which was meaningful to them. On the back, they wrote about a response which covered off one or all of why they chose that photo /why this Framework is important / a vision for Perth / what they want to see through this process. Everyone then shared their responses.• City of Perth updated at the conclusion of the community consultation and advised next steps for the plan which is to refine the initiatives with community feedback and turn them into actions to present to the Business Units for resource allocation.



		<ul style="list-style-type: none">• City of Perth noted that the prioritisation exercise didn't provide particularly clear guidance however nothing will be excluded from the draft plan. Many lower priorities are 'quick wins' with the higher priorities taking more time to implement.• Group discussed possible need for another community touch point in May. Informal meet and greet with group to ensure the community is kept engaged in the process before draft plan shared in August.
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
